

Groundwork: using lead rein, neck rein or liberty.

Ridden: two reins attached to a halter, one rein which can change sides, rope around the neck


THIS COURSE IS THE SAME AS VIOLET WHERE ONLY A NECKROPE IS ALLOWED.

YELLOW LEVEL EQUAGILITY November 2024


This is a two phase class, there are only five obstacles to negotiate. First you must complete the five obstacles on the ground with a halter and leadrope, a rope round the neck OR at liberty then you mount the horse and ride through the obstacles at the same pace as on the ground. For the ridden section you can use any of the following two reins attached to a halter, one rein which can change sides, rope around the neck For safety bridles and saddles are allowed (with or without trees), you may use a bareback pad (no stirrups) or saddle blanket and surcingle or ride bareback. If you use the bridle rein you will lose marks. You may have a neck strap or neck rope on the horse for safety.


The filming must be continuous without a break between the groundwork and the ridden part so put any saddle onto your horse before you start. You may wish to put the bridle on between the groundwork and the ridden work. THINK SAFETY AT ALL TIMES. DO NOT TAKE CHANCES you will not be judged on your riding style but your ability to be with your horse as he carries you around the course.

Closing date for entries is 30th November 2024 WHEN YOUR ENTRY IS RECEIVED BY THE CLUB OFFICE YOU WILL BE SENT A UNIQUE ENTRY CODE. IF YOU DO NOT RECEIVE THIS CODE PLEASE CONTACT THE CLUB BY EMAIL - YOUR ENTRY IS NOT VALID WITHOUT THIS CODE. REMEMBER you must keep your lead rope/rein,/neckrope loose and keep moving forward between obstacles with no circling. If you do have a tight lead rope or stop or circle BETWEEN obstacles you will lose a mark from the next obstacle's score.



3. Pole. Horse to trot over pole with front feet, halt for a count of three then back up over pole without touching it with his feet, then walk on over pole.





4. String of pearls weave. Arrange three markers in a row, horse and handler trot around them following the red line.

1. S bend. Build this carefully. Refer to handbook for sizing and see arrows on this diagram. Horse and handler to walk through S bend without touching or stepping over poles.



5. Hula hoop. Horse steps cleanly into hula hoop with hind feet for a count of three, then walks out of hoop. He may walk through with fronts first. Any touches of the hoop will lose marks.

FINISH
