


Bronze Liberty Trophy and Walking Only Bronze Liberty Trophy

January 2025 10 Obstacles each out of 10

You may choose each month which level to work at. There is NO promotion system. You may use a head collar/halter and/or a neck rope, (not connected to the halter) but when you use either to control or manoeuvre your horse you will lose points. THE JUDGE MUST HEAR THE REAL SOUND! DO NOT INCLUDE MUSIC OR A VOCAL COMMENTARY REMEMBER SAFETY FIRST! CLOSING DATE MIDNIGHT 31st January 2025 WHEN YOUR ENTRY IS RECEIVED SAFELY BY THE CLUB OFFICE YOU WILL BE SENT A UNIQUE ENTRY CODE. IF YOU DO NOT RECEIVE THIS CODE PLEASE CONTACT THE CLUB BY EMAIL YOUR ENTRY IS NOT VALID WITHOUT THIS CODE.

REMEMBER you must keep your lead rope loose and keep moving forward between obstacles with no circling. If you do have a tight lead rope, stop or circle BETWEEN obstacles you will lose a mark from the next obstacle's score.



6. Halt. After the flags, halt your horse and both horse and handler must remain still without moving feet for a count of three before walking onto the next obstacle.





7. Hula Hoop Walk. Place a hula hoop onto the ground. Horse to walk over it without his feet touching. At least one foot must step into it. Make sure we can see this clearly or you will lose marks.

5. Narrow flags. Create a narrow gap with two flags. The top of the flags must be higher than the horse's ears. It should look and feel like a squeeze. Lead your horse through safely.



8. Weave. Horse <u>and</u> handler to weave at walk through five cones together.






4. Tarpaulin. Horse and handler to walk over tarpaulin <u>together</u>.


9. Ball. Walk 3m (10ft) with your horse, handler kicking a ball in front of him. Maintain loose lead rope throughout. Does not need to be in a straight line. Ball can be any size.




2. Pole halt and backup Lead front feet of horse over pole, halt (the pole will be under his belly) for a count of one second.



3. Back horse up over pole then walk on over pole. You will lose marks for horse touching the pole with his feet.
